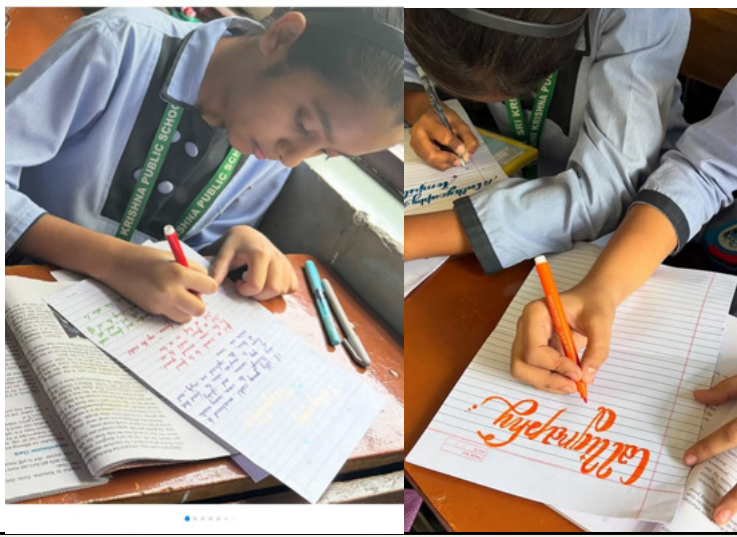
Interactive Session on Balanced Diet and Wellness
