Baisakhi : A Celebration of our school where history breathes again

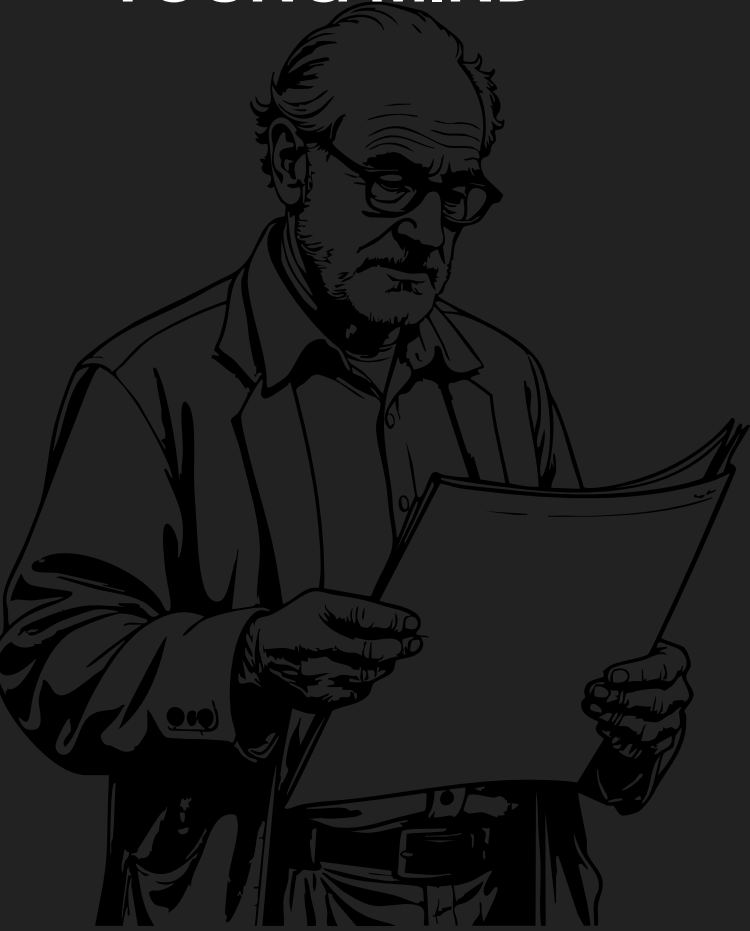
